SATURDAY: Josh Rolette drove in all three Captains runs in a 4-3 loss to the Dragons. Rolette knocked in a pair of runs in the first with a single. Dayton then scored three runs in the bottom of the first on an RBI single by Juan Martinez and a two-run double by Cameron Warren. Jay Schuyler added a solo home run in the third to extend Dayton's lead to 4-2. Rolette's sacrifice fly in the eighth capped the scoring. The Captains' offense tied a season-high with 17 strikeouts, which was a new season-high for Dayton pitching. Dragons reliever Andy Fisher earned the win after striking out seven over three scoreless, hitless innings. The lefty struck out the last six he faced, striking out the side in both the sixth and seventh innings. Matt Pidich allowed one run over two innings and left the tying run on second base in the ninth to pick up the save. Captains starter Eli Lingos took the loss, allowing four runs on eight hits over five innings.

THE RBI GUY: Josh Rolette has recorded three straight multi-RBI games. He has driven in seven runs in the last three games with three RBI Saturday night and two each of the previous two games. Rolette has gone 4-for-10 with a double in those three games.

FERMIN ON A TEAR: Since the All-Star Break, Jose Fermin is second in the Midwest League in batting average (.357), second in hits (50), fourth in on-base percentage (.420) and fifth in stolen bases (10).

GUESS WHO'S BACK: Daniel Schneemann returned from the Injured List Friday. He has slashed .361/.461/.495 with a .956 OPS in the second half. He has raised his season average from .163 to .300 and his OPS from .446 to .800 since the All-Star Break.

ADVANCED STATS: Jose Fermin owns the second-lowest strikeout percentage in the Midwest League (9.3%) and the second-lowest swinging strike percentage (3.9%). Bo Naylor is sixth in the league in line drive percentage (20.8%).

STRIKEOUTS: Since the start of the second half, the Captains' pitching staff is second in the Midwest League with 381 strikeouts. Quad Cities leads the league with 390.

JUST SCORE, BABY: The Captains are 43-7 when they score five or more runs in a game. They are 4-21 when they score two or fewer runs.

GOOD RIDDANCE, JULY: The Captains suffered their only losing month in July with a 14-15 record. Lake County also finished the month with the second-lowest team batting average in the league at .211, one point ahead of the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers (.210). The Captains' pitching staff allowed the third-highest WHIP in the league in July 1.42. Their 4.09 ERA was only sixth from the bottom, but was the highest ERA the Captains have posted in a single month this season.

CARDENAS TRADE: The Indians traded OF Ruben Cardenas to the Tampa Bay Rays on Sunday, in exchange for INF Christian Arroyo and RHP Hunter Wood. Cardenas has been assigned to the Bowling Green Hot Rods. Cardenas was third in the league in slugging percentage and fifth in OPS (.818) at the time of the trade.

TRIPLE THE FUN: The Captains record for most team triples in a game is three and Lake County has accomplished that feat six times in team history. Three of those instances have been in 2019. The Captains' offense tripled three times on May 24 at Lansing, June 28 at Lansing and July 26 at South Bend.

SHUFFLING THE DECK: MLB.com recently released its midseason prospect rankings and the list was edited again to reflect prospects who changed teams following the MLB Trade Deadline. The Captains currently feature two of the Indians' Top 30 Prospects in C Bo Naylor (#5) and RHP Luis Oviedo (#14).

NEW GUYS: Two recent acquisitions were added to MLB.com's Indians Top 30 Prospects in LHP Logan Allen (#3) and LHP Scott Moss (#17), both of whom were acquired in the Trevor Bauer deal on Tuesday. Allen pitched for the Fort Wayne TinCaps from 2016-17 and came over from the San Diego Padres. Moss pitched for the Dayton Dragons in 2017 and came over from the Cincinnati Reds.

CLINCHED: The Captains clinched a Midwest League playoff berth by winning the first half Eastern Division Wild Card. Lake County will face the first half champion Great Lakes Loons in the first round.

PLAYOFF HISTORY: Lake County has now reached the postseason six times. The Captains made the South Atlantic League playoffs in 2003 and 2008. The Captains have reached the Midwest League postseason in 2010, 2012, 2014 and 2019. They have won the division three times (2003, 2008, 2010) and the Wild Card three times (2012, 2014 and 2019). The Captains' lone league championship was in the MWL in 2010.

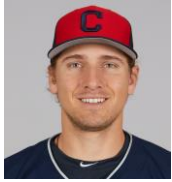

LAST TIME OUT: Ponticelli took the loss on Tuesday against Lansing. The right-hander surrendered two runs in the first on RBI singles by Hunter Steinmetz and Rafael Lantigua, and two more runs on a homer by Gabriel Moreno in the fourth. The Captains lost to the Lugnuts, 5-1.

HOME RUN TROUBLE: Ponticelli leads the league in home runs allowed (14). Among Midwest League pitchers who have thrown 80+ innings, Ponticelli has allowed the most home runs per nine innings (1.49). Dayton's Jhon De Jesus is second (1.14).

CONTROL PITCHER: Ponticelli walked just 44 batters in 236.2 career innings at the University of San Francisco for a career 1.67 BB/9 rate. He also led USF in strikeouts his sophomore year with 65 K's in 69.2 innings, walking just 10. The right-hander was a three-year starter for the Dons and ended his career with the ninth-most strikeouts in program history (187).

CAPE COD LEAGUE: Ponticelli pitched in 2016 and 2017 for the Falmouth Commodores in the prestigious Cape Cod League. Across two seasons, the right-hander made 13 relief appearances and six starts. He went 5-4 with a 5.23 ERA.

SAN FRANCISCO → CLEVELAND: Indians OF **Bradley Zimmer** (Captains '14) and RHP **Adam Cimber** are both former University of San Francisco Dons.

DONS IN THE DRAFT: 2018 marked the 14th straight year in which a USF Don has been selected in the MLB Draft. Along with Ponticelli, SS Michael Perri was selected in the 21st round by the Cardinals.

MANAGER: Luke Carlin – 2nd season in Lake County

Luke Carlin, 38, returns for his second season as the Captains' Manager, becoming the first skipper since Ted Kubiak (2010-11) to lead Lake County for multiple seasons. Carlin, the 13th field manager in team history, as the fourth manager to pilot Lake County for more than one campaign. Prior to his first year with the Captains, Carlin was the manager of the Mahoning Valley Scrappers, the Indians' Short-Season affiliate. Before Mahoning Valley, Carlin began his coaching career as the hitting coach for the Double-A Akron RubberDucks in 2016. He was drafted by the Detroit Tigers in the 10th round of the 2002 Amateur Draft. Carlin made his Major League debut with the San Diego Padres in 2008 and played for the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2009. The catcher joined the Cleveland Indians in 2010 and played in 10 Major League games with the Tribe from 2010 to 2012. Carlin was also part of back-to-back Triple-A National Championship teams with the Columbus Clippers under the direction of Indians' current Third Base Coach Mike Sarbaugh. In his playing career, Carlin played for three men who are current Major League managers: Rick Renteria (Chicago White Sox), Bud Black (Colorado Rockies) and A.J. Hinch (Houston Astros).

PITCHING COACH: Owen Dew – 1st season in Lake County

Owen Dew, 30, returns to the Captains as the team's pitching coach just eight years after he pitched for Lake County himself. Dew pitched for the Captains in 2010 and 2011, and was part of the team's lone championship squad in 2011. He was the pitching coach for the Arizona League Indians last year and for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers in 2017. Dew's Scrappers staff finished second in the New York-Penn League with a 2.92 ERA.

HITTING COACH: Jason Esposito – 1st Season in Lake County

Jason Esposito, 28, begins his second year in the professional coaching ranks after serving as the hitting coach for the Arizona League Indians last year. As a player, Esposito was drafted in the second round in 2011 by the Baltimore Orioles after attending Vanderbilt University. He spent four seasons as a third baseman in the Orioles' organization, reaching as high as Double-A Bowie.

BENCH COACH: Jordan Smith – 1st Season in Lake County

Jordan Smith, 28, is a former Captain who is returning to Lake County this year as the team's bench coach. Smith played for the Captains in the 2012 season. He hit .316 with nine home runs and 74 runs batted in for a team that included Francisco Lindor and Jose Ramirez. Captains fans gave Smith the nickname, "The Milkman," due to his love for the nutrient-rich drink. Smith played eight professional seasons, including seven in the Indians' organization. He reached as high as Triple-A Columbus.
